What is Bookshelf?

- Bookshelf is a full-text searchable online collection, database, and archive.
- Bookshelf contains online textbooks, reference books, technical reports, systematic reviews, guidelines, documents, and monographs in the life sciences, biomedicine, and healthcare.
- There are over 10,500 titles available!
- The Bookshelf archive preserves content for continued public access and does not publish content itself.
- We rely on volunteer partners and individuals to deposit materials they publish and fund.
- All materials undergo thorough peer review, in addition to NLM's internal scientific and technical review process, before acceptance to Bookshelf.



Why use Bookshelf?

- All those with an interest in science and healthcare can find relevant information on Bookshelf!
- Students can find some textbooks electronically available.
- Clinicians can find systematic reviews and clinical guidelines from national and international entities such as the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) and the World Health Organization (WHO).
- Bookshelf also hosts help manuals for different NCBI and NLM products and links structured reviews like GeneReviews to NCBI resources like PubMed, Genetics Testing Registry, and PubChem.
